

# THE PERFECT PLAYOFF PLAN

## S.A.F.E. PHILOSOPHY

This Philosophy is the basis for the Major College Football Division to make football SAFE for students, academics, fairness & equality while implementing the [Perfect Playoff Plan](#).

### Student:

An 11 Game Season reduces physical & mental stress on the athletes & the program.  
Games played on Saturdays only will reduce interference with the academic week.  
Regional Conference alignment for opponents, reduces stress of excessive travel.  
[No Patsy Rule](#), to prevent injury risk during a meaningless non-division game.  
A Maximum of 15 games for the 2 Teams in the Championship Game.

### Academics:

12 Weeks, 11 games over one Semester [Regular Season](#).  
No Games during Finals Weeks between the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday & 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of December.  
Post-Season starts the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday in December.  
Post-Season Playoffs end no later than the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday after January 4<sup>th</sup>.

### Fairness:

Only Teams with winning records (6-5) will be eligible for the Post-Season Bowls.  
Every regular season game counts toward Post-Season invitation.  
Invitation by Rule to the Playoffs (no polls, computers nor committees).  
The Traditional Post Season Bowl Games preserved.  
An [Undisputed National Champion](#) decided on the field of play.  
End special designations for conferences and Independent status ended.  
Traditional regional and conference rivalries preserved.  
[No Patsy](#) games with lower division FCS Teams  
[No Cupcake](#) or second class status for any Conferences or Teams.

### Equality:

Every Conference will have Equal Status, Size and Strength.  
Every Conference Equally sharing the [Best, Next & Last](#) teams.  
Every Conference plays a true round robin to determine their Champion.  
Every Team plays the same Major College team [Strength of Schedule](#).  
Every Conference Champion Automatically Qualified for Playoffs.  
Every Conference guaranteed 4 Post-Season Bowl Invitations for qualified teams.
